Hilly Hundred Race Report: Stuart Keen

First of all, I won't be the first to say this and certainly won't be the last...but well done to all of us! Rob said in last years report that we could win the Hilly 100, so that is exactly what we did and we can all feel a bit smug, what a result!

Getting up at 5.30 am is not the easiest thing to do on a Saturday morning when you are used to lazing in bed till 10, but this was important and I had actually woken up before the alarm went off.

And that is when it hit me (no not the alarm), I would be running leg 1 of the Hilly 100 and there would be a team of Northbrook guys relying on me to get them off to a good start, not to mess up and let them down, that's when the nerves kicked in...at about 5.30 am.

I didn't have a lot of choice but to run leg 1 as I already had a long standing day out arranged with my father in law and to do it this way should work out o.k; providing all went to plan.

So having woken up and got kitted out (checked my list!) ready to race; my nerves were slightly eased when I saw a calm overcast morning which was perfect and why should I be worried anyway, I had done the training, leg 1 wasn't too hilly I was told and the conditions looked good, but then the nerves returned, this was the kick off after-all.

We (myself, Rob & my father in law who was the taxi) got to the fountain in Stratford in good time where I was able to do a few warm ups and observe the other runners as they arrived, which was when Rob remarked that they all looked 'a bit smokey', 'so just enjoy it'.

'Great' I thought 'this is the 1st leg and the other clubs have put in their top runners and I'm supposed to enjoy it!?' Bromsgrove & Redditch had put in an A & B team at the 7am start, Graham Patton was running for Sphinx and there was Leamington C & AC, Stratford AC and Kenilworth Runners all lined up and ready to go...in the rain by now, but it was still cool and calm at least.

7am came round and we were off with B'grove and Redditch 'A' and Leam. C & AC off to a flying start; closely followed by Sphinx, K'worth, B'grove & Redditch 'B'; myself then Stratford. And that is how it stayed for the first few miles, up to Luddington in fact.

The B & R 'A' team runner had stormed off, but interestingly the Leam. C & AC runner was dropping back and it was also around this point that I passed the B & R 'B' team runner; still with Sphinx a close 3rd and K'worth a closer 4th. It was when we were back on the main road that things took another turn as Sphinx and K'worth had both passed Leam. C & AC and were neck & neck with each other, I then passed the Leam. Runner (was this the same chap that was flying at the start?) and now had K'worth in my sights as I could see that Sphinx were starting to edge forward.

B & R 'A' team had long since disappeared from view, Sphinx were now a comfortable 2nd, K'worth 3rd and myself in 4th trying my hardest to catch K'worth as we approached the brow of Welford Hill. But try as hard as I could there was still too much distance between us and we were well over half way by now; but at least the only 'real' hill in Leg 1 had passed and it was just a long; flat road to the finish.

Bob Awcock was great with encouragement (and pointing out to me the tallest maypole in Britain...sorry I wasn't more enthusiastic Bob!) and so was my father in law and Rob who would pull over every now and again to shout me on, but K'worth still had plenty left in the tank and as I would close up he would pull away.

Graham from Sphinx was still in a comfortable 2nd but seemed to be tiring a bit as he kept looking round over his shoulder and this is how it stayed as we passed through Long Marston for the final couple of miles; until the final 400 mtrs when the finish was in sight at Pitchall Farm and I managed a sprint finish to just catch K'worth at the change over to Rob.

Knackered & elated having just run a PB in 59.29, we'd had a good change over; Rob was on his way and Northbrook were in joint 3rd place. B & R 'A' team had run leg 1 in 54 mins so were clearly in the lead at this time with Sphinx about 5 mins behind; closely followed by Northbrook and K'worth...the day was going to take a few twists and turns! The Leam. C & AC runner had collapsed at the road side further back; we were told and had to taken to hospital but was going to be o.k. B & R 'B' team came in a few mins later; followed by Stratford.

I had done my bit for Northbrook and went on to have a cracking day at The Heart Of England Falconry Centre within Mary Arden's House in Wilmcote on a hawk handling course with my father in law...but made sure I was back in Stratford later on to see the winning team come in!!!
